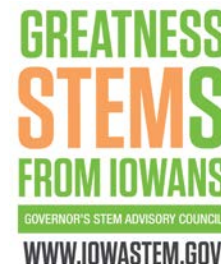

Not to mention evaluation by an independent assessment consortium that citizens can trust to gauge our progress. All of this begs the question: Given the financial condition in which we find ourselves – shrinking legislative purse and STEM budget fully committed to current programs – How should the Governor's STEM Council proceed to shape the future of STEM, of schooling, of work-and-life readiness for our youth, and how could we more purposefully engage our private sector as well as higher education, nonprofits, others in shaping our STEM future?</p>
